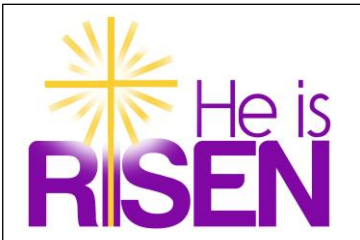

**First and foremost, the Priests and staff of St. Francis Assisi Pastorate wish you all a Happy Easter!**

This Sunday we celebrate the triumph of Our Lord who rose from His grave after offering Himself as a sacrifice for our own sins. This victory of Jesus Christ the Son of God is one of the most important pillars of our Christian Faith. First, and most obviously, the Resurrection of the Lord teaches us that our own physical death, even though it is inevitable, is not the end. For not only does the soul continue to live on but we look forward to when Jesus will come to set us free from our own graves. After all, death cannot stop Jesus who conquered death itself.

Secondly, we must keep in mind that the Resurrection was granted to the Son who was obedient to the Father. Jesus emphasized how He came not to do His own will but the will of the Father (John 6:38). And even though the Son feared the grim fate of crucifixion, in the end He chose to accept the Father's will as He said, "yet, not as I will but as you will (Matthew 26:39)." What then is the Father's will? We find the guidelines in the book of the prophet Isaiah: to bring good news to the afflicted; to heal the broken hearted; and to set captives free (61:1). This indicates that when we too faithfully carry out the Father's directions, we will also overcome death itself. In other words, the Resurrection is granted to those who practice the teachings of Christ which is to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mark 12:29-31).

Thirdly, the Resurrection also teaches us how we must put our own ego to death. In our current lives, the ego – the selfish part of ourselves – chains us and we constantly struggle with the ego who is driven by passion and desire. Jesus' own struggle with the ego became evident when, in the Garden of Gethsemane, He asked His Father if His crucifixion could be avoided. Plus, Jesus was tempted throughout His public life to become the Ruler of a Kingdom instead of the Good Shepherd who would lay down His life for His sheep. Nonetheless, when Christ chose to give Himself up as an atonement for our sins, He also put to death all the desires of the ego. This teaches us that we are to make the same choice if we are to also be raised from the dead. In other words, as Christians who follow the example of the Lord, we do not live for ourselves, but we offer ourselves for the salvation for all and for God our Father who desires to bring His children back to His home.

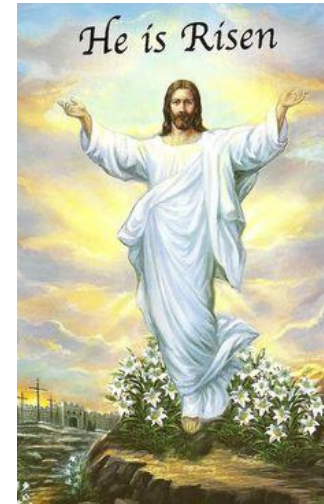
